# Curriculum for class VI to VIII

The curriculum refers to the educational content to be taught to a learner in a school. It may be regarded as the sum of total planned set of educational experiences provided by the school. The curriculum is based on the opportunities for students to achieve excellence in learning.

# The objective of curriculum:

- To achieve cognitive, effective psychomotor excellence
- To enhance self awareness and explore innate potential
- To attain mastery over laid down competencies
- To imbibe 21<sup>st</sup> century learning literacy and life skills
- To inculcate values and faster cultural learning
- To strengthen knowledge and attitude related to livelihood skills
- To promote physical fitness and well being
- To promote art integrated learning

## **Curricular Areas**

- Languages include Hindi, English and Sanskrit. The curricula in languages focus on listening, speaking, reading and writing skills hence to develop effective communicative skill.
- Mathematics includes acquiring the concepts related to number sense, computation, measurement, geometry, skill to calculate and organize and ability to apply this knowledge in their daily life and skill to think mathematically.
- 3. Computer include the basic concepts of computer and operation of the software related to internet, MS- Office and other activities.
- 4. Science (Biology, Chemistry & Physics) includes gaining knowledge about food, materials, the world of living, how things works, moving things, natural phenomena and resources. The focus is to develop a scientific attitude and apply knowledge for improving the quality of life.
- 5. Social Science(Geography, History, Economics and Political Science) includes learners to understand their cultural, geographical and historical facts and gain attitude, skills and values to bring about transformation for better society. Learners also understand

constitutional values and norms, politics, economy and societal interactions.

6. Moral Science & G.K. includes current awareness, manners and

etiquettes needed in civilised society.

7. **Drawing & SUPW** entails instruction in various art forms such as visual and performing with an aim to help children to develop interest and encourage them enthusiasm to participate in related activities like imagination, creativity, thinking and expression.

8. Art & Physical Education, Discipline, Sports, Dance, Drama, Singing, Debate, General knowledge etc. to focus on holistic development of students, both mental and physical, for betterment of

society and nation.

# **Assessment & Evaluation Method**

As per CBSE/CM/2017 Circular No.: Acad- 14 /2017 Date: 21/03/2017 Keeping in view the provisions of Right to Education Act, 2009, the scheme for classes VI-VIII has been designed on Term Assessment basis with gradual increase in the learning assessment as the students move forward. This would prepare the students to cover the whole syllabus of the academic year and face the challenge of class X Board examination, and would thus, ensure the 'quality of education'.

**Scholastic Area:** The assessment structure and examination for classes VI to VIII have been prepared in view of the provisions of RTE-Act 2009 and comprises of two terms i.e. **Half Yearly and Annual** as explained below:

Co-Scholastic Activities (Classes VI-VIII): For the holistic development of the student, co-curricular activities in the following areas be carried out in CBSE affiliated schools by the teachers and will be graded term-wise on a 3-point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair). The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output and teamwork be the generic criteria for grading in the following co-scholastic activities:

SUPW - Work Education refers to skill-based activities resulting in goods or services useful to the community (b) Drawing (Visual & Performing Art) (c) Health and Physical Education (Sports/Martial Arts/Yoga/NCC etc.)

**Discipline (Classes VI-VIII):** The students will also be assessed for the discipline which will be based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behaviour, values, tidiness, respectfulness for rules and regulations, attitude towards society, nation and others.

Grading on Discipline will be done term-wise on a 3-point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair)
